


A Personal Assessment Tool for reconnecting your life and work to the advancement of God's kingdom

WHY THIS TOOL? WHY THESE QUESTIONS?

Jesus taught his disciples to pray, "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven."

We are to be about God's mission on this earth. God's mission is his kingdom come, his will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

WHAT IS GOD'S KINGDOM?

In its simplest terms, the kingdom of God is where God reigns as king. It is where the will of God is done.



We are to connect all of our lives to God's kingdom purposes. This includes all of our "work" life. Our work includes not only the 100,000 hours we apply to our vocation but also the work we do washing the dishes, mowing the lawn, caring for children, helping the neighbor, going to school, and even working out at the gym.

How do we connect all of our work to God's kingdom purposes?

The application exercise will enable you to critically reflect on how your specific work connects to God's purpose to bless, heal, and restore this broken world.

You will reflect on (1) how your work connects to the first commandment in Genesis 1 – the Cultural Commission, (2) how, through your work, you can fulfill the summary commandment to love your neighbor, and (3) how developing and applying your abilities can further God's kingdom.

HOW DOES MY WORK FULFILL GOD'S FIRST COMMANDMENT – THE CULTURAL COMMISSION?

God's first commandment in Genesis 1 is to rule over the earth and life, to fill the earth and subdue it, to work at and tend the garden. This is often referred to as the Cultural Commission (or Cultural Mandate).

In short, we are to take all God has given us, create with it, and make the world and all of life better.

Nancy Pearcey, in her book *Total Truth: Liberating Christianity from Its Cultural Captivity*, further explains why this commandment has been called the Cultural Mandate:

The first phrase, 'be fruitful and multiply,' means to develop the social world: build families, churches, schools, cities, governments, laws. The second phrase, 'subdue the earth,' means to harness the natural world: plant crops, build bridges, design computers, and compose music. This passage is sometimes called the Cultural Mandate because it tells us that our original purpose was to create cultures, build civilizations – nothing less.

2.3 The Cultural Commission is given to every person. No one is exempt. In your work, how can you help your co-workers and customers to better fulfill this command?

HOW DOES MY WORK FULFILL GOD'S COMMANDMENT TO LOVE MY NEIGHBOR?

The Great Commandment is to love God with all our being, and the second is to love our neighbor. Galatians 5:14 tells us that all of God's commands can be summarized by this: Love your neighbor. The principal way we demonstrate our love for God is by loving our neighbor.

What does it mean to love your neighbor? Is it a feeling? Is it a special act of kindness? In its simplest terms, to love your neighbor is to seek the highest good and do the highest good for the other person. To love others through your work is to do and speak what is best for the other person. When we do so, all flourish. This is God's design.

What does loving your neighbor in the workplace look like? It could be providing the best-quality product or service, keeping your word, being diligent, treating co-workers and customers with dignity and respect as fellow image bearers of God, etc.
